PRE-COUNCIL SESSION CALLED TO ORDER at 6:47pm by Mayor Yeager.

Discussion of Agenda Items:

(6B) - Community Development Director David Curwen discussed the current status of the automatic meter read program. The agreement will provide for installation to begin in September and continue through October, thus spanning two fiscal year's budgets. Mayor Yeager reiterated the Council's desire, as discussed last month, to get the entire city moved to this program as quickly as possible. Some discussion continued. City Administrator Roger Unger stated there is one million dollars in reserve funds. The total project is expected to cost \$210,000 over two budget years.

- Mayor Yeager stated the P&Z approved the re-plat earlier this evening. Roger Unger stated the streets are currently included in the lots. Re-platting will change them to city streets which will increase the value of the lots. Legacy Bank supports this move to encourage development. Streets will be renamed to provide proper 911 response.

3. Staff Updates:

A. Kevin Reaves, Police Chief

- **PD Reports:** Dec 1437 CFS (160 Priority 1, 189-911), a 21% decrease in CFS over Dec 2015. 1174 dispatched calls to Lakeside; call volume has increased by 37% over Dec 2015. 177 Citations/138 Warnings, 32 Arrests (105 FYTD). Jailed two each for Lakeside and Westover Hills. 101 Warrants Cleared. Santa event was well attended. Officer and Dispatcher recruitment ongoing to fill vacancies. Anticipate offering dispatch position to Alex Ives. Second officer testing will be held on Jan 23rd.
- Aton Traffic Study presentation: Study included monitoring 15 days of normal traffic patterns. Average 500 cars/day on weekdays and 186 cars/day on the weekend. Almost all drivers were within the speed limit. While the study showed a high volume, speed is not a problem. Councilwoman Patton asked for more studies in different areas of the City. Chief confirmed officers are still the first responders on fire calls.

B. Ryan Studdard, Building Official

- Code Enforcement Report: 35 Warnings/0 Citations compared to 64/0 in Dec 2014. 2015 YTD 789/3.
- Building Inspection Report: 92 Inspections (89 in-house, 3 CodePro) compared to 59/16 Dec 2014. 2015 YTD 644/27. Three homes are under construction in the Village. Westworth Falls subdivision will break ground soon. Permits will be pulled in the next few weeks. Krispy Kreme is getting close to completion; job applications are being accepted. Lots adjacent to the storage facility have sold to the Westover Group.

D. Rhonda Hines, Librarian

• Library Report: OverDrive application is running; 5 patrons have used it to check out 28 books. Included in the packet are TSLAC facility comparisons by population and area. Councilman Beckman thanked Rhonda for the information and stated the Library has a significant opportunity for growth. Participation in the Consortium and the OverDrive application dramatically improves available resources.

E. Sterling Naron, Parks & Golf Operations Supervisor

- Golf Club Report: 2504 Rounds, \$120,131 Revenue. Closed 3.5 days (2 weather, 1.5 holiday). December weather was definitely a factor in the high volume for the month, breaking the Dec 2014 record. 63 Preferred Members; First annual tournament scheduled for March 18th. Completed projects: tree trimming, weather clean-up.
- **Kyle Sheffer,** 1st Asst Pro, is now a US Kids Certified Instructor. HC is initiating a new PGA program for junior league golf for boys and girls, 13 and under.

F. David Curwen, Director of Community Development

- Community Development Report: AMR System is on agenda for approval tonight as discussed in pre-Council session. F&N has completed a draft zoning map to be used in the GIS program. Data collection continues. Base map will be uploaded. David is working on the Lyle/Straley/Trigg/KC Springs utility project contract.
- Public Works Service Order Report: 79 Service Orders.

G. Roger Unger, City Administrator

- Capital Projects/Infrastructure: David has taken the lead on all PW projects.
- **TAP Grant Update:** Meeting is scheduled to discuss the pedestrian underpass. Trail design is 45-50% complete.
- **Budget/Disbursements:** Budget is on track as expected. Valuations came in less than expected across all entities, primarily due to the new computer system at the Tarrant Appraisal District. Westworth continues to be in good shape financially. Gas well revenue holding steady at an average of \$35K/month.
- **Developers** are making daily inquiries; expect to see growth continue in 2016. **Westworth Falls** is conducting traffic work to eliminate the crossover. Lee Nichols has purchased just under two acres of land at Smallwood and White Settlement; expect concept plan to be submitted soon.
- Part-time employee, Peggy Arias, has been made full-time in the Water Dept. Melanie will move to Permits, still backing up Water. Peggy will continue to back-up Court. Stacey Reid has accepted the Court Clerk position, but will be available to back-up Dispatch if needed.

H. Carol Borges, City Secretary

• Election 2016: City Council Places 2, 3, and 4 are up for election. Candidate packets are available at City Hall or online. Filing period is January 20th through February 19th. A Special Election to renew the City's street maintenance sales tax will be held in conjunction with the General Election.

- **B.** Library Committee Jill Patton, Chair Rhonda will be making a presentation at the March luncheon to showcase available programs and resources. Councilwoman Patton is interested in participating in the City's anniversary celebration.

- **D. Vision Committee** Steve Beckman, Chair Committee met this afternoon to discuss redevelopment of historic Westworth. Chief Reaves presented several ideas to celebrate the City's 75th Anniversary. More information to come.

SECOND by Nick Encke. Motion passed unanimously by a vote of 5 Ayes and 0 Nays.

B. Mayor Yeager

Discuss and take action with respect to implementing the automatic meter read system.

- Mayor Yeager thanked David for his efforts on this project and moving the City forward with new and improved technology.
- MOTION made by Jill Patton for staff to implement the automatic meter read system and authorize Mayor Yeager to sign the Master Agreement for a total cost not to exceed \$207,000 over two fiscal years. SECOND by Mike Coleman. Motion passed unanimously by a vote of 5 Ayes and 0 Nays.

- Admin Asst Brandy Barrett stated in conjunction with the meter read program changes to the
 ordinances are needed to improve processes and put procedures in place to allow for different
 types of account holders, remove hard dates, update termination and reconnect language, and set
 the fee schedule.
