Census 2020

The 2020 Census will be conducted on April 1, 2020. As is required by the U.S. Constitution, every decade, the federal government conducts a census of the entire population to count everyone in the United States and record basic information about them.

The census is much more than just a head count. It provides a picture of our nation that helps determine where to build new schools, hospitals, and businesses; how more than \$675 billion in federal funding is distributed; and how congressional seats are apportioned. It also helps us see how our communities have changed over time. That's why an accurate count is so important.

While the completion of census questionnaires are required, federal law protects the confidentiality of all individual responses that the Census Bureau collects.

High Grass Season

The City would like to remind our citizens of the importance of maintaining their yards and alleyways. Please do not allow grass or weeds to exceed ten inches (10") in height. Property owners & tenants are responsible for keeping their lawns mowed to the edge of the streets and alleyways. Only one notification per year will be made. Those in violation who fail to comply with City Ordinances are subject to citation, and/or having their property mowed by a City-hired contractor. The owner of the lot will be billed for the City's expenses plus an administrative fee. If the bill is not paid, interest-bearing liens will be placed on the property. Being proactive helps continue our effort to keep our city beautiful and clean. FloodSmart Information

Westworth Village would like to provide our residents with information about floods and flood insurance. Floods are the nation's most common disaster and more than 20% of flood claims come from properties outside of high-risk flood zones. Homeowners and renters insurance typically does not cover flood damage and even just one inch of water can cost more than \$25,000 in damages.

The best way to mitigate losses in the case of a flood is to purchase flood insurance. Flood insurance can pay regardless of whether or not there is a Presidential Disaster Declaration.
