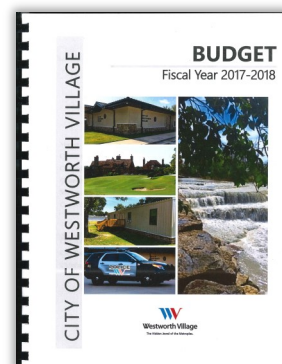

Trash Pick-Up Information

Just a reminder to our residents about yard trimming and bulk item trash pick-up services:

For both Wednesdays and Saturdays:

- Items may not cover or block the sidewalks.
- You are allowed 3 cubic yards (that is roughly the size of three washing machines side by side).

Wednesday services include yard trimmings.

- Bundled brush and limbs cannot be longer than 4 feet and cannot weigh more than 50 pounds. This also applies to the cut up parts of a trunk tree.
- Leaves should be bagged in heavy duty paper lawn bags (preferred) or in large industrial plastic bags.
- Brush limbs and bags of leaves should not be put out to the curb before 7 p.m. Tuesday night .

Saturday services include bulky items.

- Examples of bulky items include: furniture, stoves, washers and dryers.
- Items containing Freon (such as refrigerators, freezers or air conditioners) **will not** be picked up.
- Bulky items are not allowed to be put out on the curb before 7 p.m. Friday night .

Burton Hill Elementary Walkathon

On **Friday, October 27th from 8:30—10:30 a.m.**, Burton Hill Elementary will be holding their annual Walkathon Fundraiser. This year their goal is to raise \$35,000 that will be used to purchase technology to aid in educating the students of BHE.

How to Get Involved:

-Make a donation to a student or directly to the school at the front office. Walkathon donations will be accepted until October 27th.

-Eat at Raising Canes on October 11th from 3-8 pm and mention the walkathon—a portion of the proceeds will go towards the fundraiser

-If you own a local business and donate \$750—\$1000 by October 13th, you will get your logo on the parade banner, the back of the walkathon t-shirt, the PTO website and Facebook page, and a half page spread in the yearbook. Contact the school or BHE PTO to learn about the other sponsorship levels.

The route beings in front of the school, turns right on Burton Hill Rd., turns left on Randolph Ct, left on Tanny, left on Dennis, and then left on Ainsley back to the school.

Please plan accordingly, as there will be road detours in place during this time.



USPS Informed Delivery

One common way for people to commit identity theft is through stealing mail that contains personal information or credit card offers. The United States Postal Service offers a free service called **Informed Delivery** designed to help combat this issue. Informed Delivery allows you to view scanned images of all of the letter-sized mail pieces that are delivered to your house via automatic daily notifications. Signing up is simple, quick, and free. In order to sign up:

1. Go to informedelivery.usps.com
2. Select "Sign Up for Free"
3. Enter your address to determine if it is eligible for Informed Delivery.
4. If your address is eligible, login to your *usps.com* account and skip to step 5 below. If you do not have a *usps.com* account, create one and then follow steps 4A-4D.
 - A. After you create your *usps.com* account, select "Informed Delivery" in the top right of your profile page.
 - B. Select "Enroll" and scroll down to the Informed Delivery box under "Account Management". Click the box to expand it.
 - C. Select the appropriate boxes to agree to the terms and conditions and certify your address, then select "Enroll in Informed Delivery" to continue.
 - D. Complete the identity verification questions
5. Opt-in to Informed Delivery by selecting "Enroll" and fill out your username, password, security questions, and contact information to create your profile.
6. Complete the identity verification process (if you have not already done so when setting up your *usps.com* account).
7. You should begin receiving notifications within a week.
