A Message from Mayor Mike Coleman



I love Westworth Village! Susan and I greatly enjoy living here. I hope all of you do too. There are a lot of changes happening in our city – additional commercial development, three new neighborhoods under construction, and brand new and remodeled homes being completed within Central Westworth. The City Trail project will finally be contracted this fall and when finished will connect all sides of the city to Airfield Falls and the Trinity Trail system with an off-road walking and biking path and more sidewalks. Also, the alley paving that is currently in progress is going to be amazing! It will dress up the city, provide for greatly improved storm drainage and in the long-term will lead to much less parking on our city streets. Change is good! It is good - BUT it must be managed to ensure alignment with the City's vision.

The Westworth Village Vision Statement was adopted by the City Council on February 12, 2013. So, as we all watch the changes happening in our city, I want you to be aware and assured that the current leaders of Westworth Village – the City Council and your Mayor, are working diligently to ensure that all the growth and development align with our City Vision.

Specifically, this Council is committed to a separation of commercial development from our single family residential neighborhoods, yet at the same time providing access to those businesses, our schools, and our recreational spaces through walkable sidewalks and trails. To strengthen this separation, the long-term City growth plan does not allow commercial development along Hwy 183 east of King's Branch Creek.

Also, this Council has kept its commitment to encourage investment and owner occupancy in our single-family neighborhoods. Paving the alleys and ensuring that new homes are built to improved city construction standards go a long way to increasing owner occupancy of single-family homes in our city.

Additionally, the safety of our citizens is at the very top of the list of priorities. We want this city to remain one of the safest cities in Texas. Our police force, led by Chief Kevin Reaves, is one to be very proud of.

As your Mayor, I want to thank you for allowing this Council to lead Westworth Village into the future.
