May 5th, 2018 General Election

The City will hold a General Election on Saturday, May 5, 2018. Early voting will begin on April 23rd and run through May 1st. The closest early voting location for Westworth Village residents is River Oaks City Hall, 4900 River Oaks Boulevard, River Oaks, TX 76114.

Candidates for the 2018 Election have been invited to participate in the following events:

Candidate Introductions

Tuesday, April 10th, at 12:30pm at the monthly community luncheon in the Community Room. The Chief of Police will emcee and the City Secretary will serve as moderator.

Rules:

1. Each candidate, in order of the ballot, will be given five (5) minutes to speak to the audience.
2. The candidates have the option not to attend.
3. The audience will not be given the opportunity to ask questions at this event.
4. The moderator will serve as the time keeper, and may extend the time for equality.

Candidate Forum

Tuesday, April 17th, at 6:30pm, in the Council Chamber. The City Secretary will act as emcee and moderator.

Forum Rules:

1. Each candidate, in order of the ballot, will be given three (3) minutes for an opening statement.
2. The audience will be given the opportunity to ask questions. Questions must be directed to a specific candidate and asked from the lectern, using the microphone.
3. The candidate has the option not to answer a question, if answered responses should be limited to the posed question.
4. If the same question is posed to more than one candidate, the response from each candidate will be limited to one minute. The moderator will serve as the time keeper, and may extend the time for equality.
5. Each candidate, in reverse order from item #1, will be given three (3) minutes for a closing statement.

1. All alleyways will be one-way streets that lead to Tanny Street.
2. It will be the responsibility of the house occupant to keep their portion of the alleyway properly maintained.
3. Per city ordinance, street numbers are required to be displayed in a manner that is visible from the alleys and be a minimum of 4" tall.
