Trail System Update

At the September 11, 2018 City Council Meeting, the Council voted to deny the construction bid for the Trail System. They have directed Freese and Nichols Engineering to pursue an alternate path utilizing the existing Pumphrey underpass to decrease the cost of the project.

There are now two new proposed alternates. The first would drop one of the southbound lanes under Highway 183 going outbound from the base. The second would shift the existing median over, creating two lanes going outbound from the base and one going inbound. (See inside for alternate plan renderings.) 

Tarrant County Transportation Services

The city has added a second guaranteed pick up day with Tarrant County Transportation Services. This is a county wide service for residents 65 and older and persons with disabilities. Westworth Village residents are guaranteed rides on Mondays and Wednesdays for \$2.50 one-way from 6 AM to 6 PM. For registration and reservations, please call Catholic Charities, 817-336-8714.

Westworth Village Recycling

The city provides a recycling program through our waste management company, Waste Connections. Recycling pick up is Wednesdays at 7:00 AM. Acceptable items include: metal cans, glass bottles and jars, newspapers, magazines, phone books, junk mail advertisements, plastic #1 and #7 (milk, juice, detergent jugs, etc), and chipboard (cereal boxes, soda boxes, etc). No other items are accepted. Please rinse all cans, bottles, and glass jars before placing in the recycle bin.
