November Election

The City will hold a General Election on Tuesday, November 3, 2020. Voting will take place at City Hall from 7 AM—7 PM. The ballot will appear as follows:

- Place 2: Michael Dingman / Tiffany Aller
- Place 3: Brian Libbey / Phillip Poole
- Place 4: Abraham Elizondo, Unopposed
- Place 5: Dore Hendrix / Dani Briones

On the ballot, citizens will also be presented with the opportunity to vote on the reauthorization of the 1/4 cent street maintenance sales tax. This tax expires and must be voted on for reauthorization every four years. This tax does not affect personal property taxes unless voters choose not to reauthorize it.

This tax generates restricted revenue to fund Street Department equipment, maintenance supplies, and personnel.

No Outside Storage

Storage of items on front porches, carports, and side yards is against city ordinance. Storing items such as indoor furniture, appliances, construction material, general household items, toys, scrap metal, automotive parts, tires, trash bags, clothes, etc. visible to public view could invite vandals who are looking for valuables in the neighborhood and the City, creating a danger to everyone. It also increases the rodent population and creates a health and sanitation hazard. Covering/tarping the outside storage pile does not correct the violation. Those in violation who fail to comply with City ordinances will receive a citation if the violation is not corrected within the allotted time.

Cease the Grease—Holiday Grease Roundup

This year, from November 23—January 4, we will be participating in the <u>free</u> Holiday Grease Roundup. There will be a barrel outside the Public Works building at 128 Koldin Ln, available 24/7 to recycle your cooking oil and grease. (Motor oil and other automotive fluids are not accepted.)



Residents should never dispose of cooking grease or cooking oils by washing them down the plumbing system or the storm drain. Oils pollute our streams and creeks by forming a film on the water surface and preventing oxygenation for aquatic life. Polluted water runoff can lead to severe State and Federal fines. As sewer pipes back up, food and sewage particles accumulate to create a health hazard by attracting insects and vermin.
