

Primary Elections

The Westworth Village Community Room, located at 311 Burton Hill Rd., Westworth Village, TX 76114, will be a polling location for the Primary Elections to be held on Tuesday, March 1st from 7 AM—7 PM. We will not have any ballot measures on this election.



Annual Spring Clean-Up

The annual spring clean up for the city will be held in the Municipal Complex Parking Lot:

- Saturday, April 17, 2022 from 7:00 AM to 4:00 PM
- Remember to bring proof of residency (copy of water bill or drivers license).

We cannot accept paints, tires, oil, insecticides, items that are harmful to the environment, refrigerators, air conditioners, any Freon bearing items, batteries, or other hazardous material.

 If you need to dispose of the above hazardous waste you may do so at our Fall Clean-Up Event or visit our Water Department to purchase a voucher to Fort Worth's Environmental Collection Center. Vouchers cost \$50 and you must bring your driver's license or current water bill with you for proof of residency



Volunteer Income Tax Assistance

For low to moderate income families who need help filing their prior year of current income taxes, the IRS supports a free Volunteer Income Tax Assistance program (VITA).

Who qualifies:

- Taxpayers who make less than \$60,000 per year.
- Individuals who are filing their current year (2021) taxes and past year returns for 2020,2019, and 2018.

Taxpayers who are NOT eligible:

- Taxpayers who use the Married Filing Separately Status.
- Taxpayers who have rental income.
- Taxpayers who are filing state returns (Texas does not have state income taxes)
