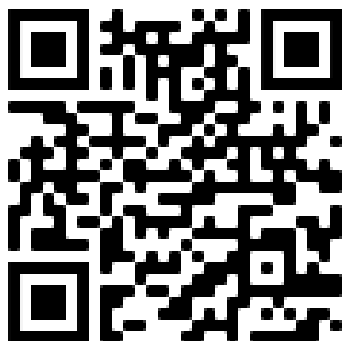

183 Median Citizen Input Request

Citizens:

You will all be receiving a separate letter regarding this issue in the coming week, but below find a briefing of what the city will be requesting from you:

In an effort to address citizen safety concerns regarding the influx of cut-through traffic from 183 on Koldin Ln. and Casstevens St., the city has been working with TXDOT to find a solution. Over the last several months, we have discussed several options in our committee and council meetings. We have come up with the following proposal to submit to TXDOT:

- Temporary installation of barricades closing both Koldin Ln. and Casstevens St. medians. Chief Reaves will monitor traffic patterns along 183 and report the results back to TXDOT for possible adjustments.



- TXDOT will assess the situation. If the temporary measures are successful for both the city and TXDOT, we will replace the temporary barricades and median asphalt in those areas with grass.
- TXDOT will continue to use this model as part of their 183 corridor project and the city will not seek to reopen them.

The results of our citizen feedback will be delivered to TXDOT on July 13th. If the results show to be favorable for the plan, we should be able to have the barricades installed in August and will keep our citizens updated accordingly. As always, my office is available should have any questions.
