Burton Hill Elementary Opens for School

As the school year approaches, please be aware of children walking to school and crossing the streets. Burton Hill Elementary will be back in session on **Monday**, **August 15 2022**. The school zone on Burton Hill Road is 20 mph. Flashing light signals will remind you to slow down.

The building opens daily at 7:30 AM. The school parking lot is for school staff only. Drivers are asked to park on the right hand side of the street by the fence in front of the school.

West Fork Basin Parallel Relief Sewer Line (M199)

We are working with the City of Fort Worth as they move toward installing a new 48" relief sewer main to accommodate increasing development in the region. The main will run parallel to the Trinity, including the areas from Westworth Falls down to Burton Hill Elementary. As such, Westworth Village will be affected during construction, with Pecan and Sky Acres residents seeing most of the impact.

A WebEx community design meeting will be held on Thursday, August 18 at 6:00 PM and an in person one will be held Monday, August 22 at 6:00 PM at City Hall to gather citizen input.

Irrigation Restrictions

As this scorching Texas summer continues, all citizens should remain mindful of their water consumption and help do their part. The city has year-round irrigation restrictions in our ordinances as follows:

- With the exception of hand watering and soaker hoses, no irrigation is allowed between 10:00 AM and 6:00 PM
- No watering during precipitation
- Substantial water is not to fall upon impervious or saturated areas such that a constant stream of water overflows from the lawn or landscape onto the street or drainage area
- Irrigation systems must be regularly maintained and free of broken sprinkler heads

Though we are not yet under county-wide water restrictions, we encourage residents to observe a twice a week watering schedule in order to conserve.

If you are utilizing well water, please have signage posted indicating well water is in use and ensure that the alternative water source has been properly registered with the city.

Annual Fall Clean-Up

The annual Fall Clean-Up for the city will be held in the Municipal Complex Parking Lot:

- Saturday, September 17, 2022—7:00 AM to 4:00 PM
- Remember to bring proof of residency (copy of water bill or drivers license).

We cannot accept paints, tires, oil, insecticides, items that are harmful to the environment, refrigerators, air conditioners, any Freon bearing items, batteries, or other hazardous material.

If you need to dispose of hazardous waste at any time, please visit our Water Department to purchase a voucher to Fort Worth's Environmental Collection Center. Vouchers cost \$50 and you must bring your driver's license or current water bill with you for proof of residency.
