## **Drug Take Back**

On **April 22nd, from 10 AM—2 PM,** Westworth Village PD will be hosting a DEA Drug Take Back Event at the Walmart located in Westworth Village at 6770 Westworth Blvd, Westworth Village, TX 76114.

Please bring in your expired, unwanted, or unused medications for destruction. These items can pose a risk for drug abuse or overdose, as well as contaminate the water supply if they are disposed of improperly, so we encourage all to take advantage of this opportunity.

We are unable to accept intravenous solutions, injectable items, and syringes. This program is anonymous. You may dispose of medication in its original container or by removing the medication from its container and disposing of it directly into the disposal box. Liquid products should remain sealed in their original container. This event is for the general public only. Pharmacies, physicians, veterinarians, etc. may not dispose of products here.

## **High Grass Season**

The City would like to remind our citizens of the importance of maintaining their yards and alleyways in order to keep our city beautiful, safe, and clean.

Property owners and tenants are responsible for keeping their lawns mowed to the edge of the streets and alleyways to a height not to exceed ten inches (10"). Please also be aware that sweeping clippings down the storm drain is also a violation of city ordinance. It is the responsibility of the resident's to ensure these ordinances are observed, and to make any persons performing lawn services at their residence are also aware and in compliance.

Those who fail to comply with city ordinances are subject to citation, and/or having their property mowed by a City-hired contractor. The owner of the lot will be billed for the City's expenses plus an administrative fee. If the bill is not paid, interest-bearing liens will be placed on the property.

As a reminder, the city's waste services provide brush and limb pick up every Wednesday.
