### **Melva Campbell Park Reservations**

The city has launched the long-awaited reservation system for Melva Campbell Park! To access this system or learn more about the process, you can visit <u>www.cityofwestworth.com/facility-rentals</u> or scan the QR code below! **Here are answers to some of our park rental FAQs:** 

- The city allows one reservation per rental area per day—3 pavilions and the pickleball court.
- Rentals can be made in 2, 4, or 6 hour durations.
- Westworth Village residents receive discount pricing and must be able to provide proof of residency upon request.
- Reservations are not valid until the requester has received approval confirmation and made payment in full through our online payment portal.
- All areas of the park are available for public use on a first come, first served basis unless the area has been reserved through our system.
- Public restrooms and water fountains are always available inside the Police Department lobby.

### Water Conservation Tips

Water is one of our most precious resources. It should be conserved year round, but as the heat of the summer approaches, it is more important than ever to be mindful of your usage.

#### Indoors:

- Fix dripping faucets by replacing washers, as continuous small drops add up quickly.
- Check all plumbing for leaks and have any leaks repaired by a plumber.
- Monitor your water usage using your Eye on Water.
- Choose energy and water efficient appliances, low flow shower heads, and low-volume toilets.
- Don't pour water down the drain when there may be another use for it (i.e. watering plants)
- Don't leave water running when performing daily tasks such as washing dishes, brushing your teeth, or shaving.
- Wash only full loads of laundry and dishes.

#### Outdoors:

- Position sprinklers so water lands on the lawn and shrubs and not on paved areas.
- Don't over-fertilize your lawn and apply fertilizers that contain slow-release, water-insoluble forms of nitrogen.
- Check sprinkler systems and timing devices regularly to be sure they operate correctly.
- Cover pools and spas to reduce water evaporation.
